

#NOTRACE CAMPING

(outside of District of Squamish boundaries)

- District bylaws prohibit campfires on public lands, and provincial fire bans restrict campfires outside municipal boundaries. Know before you go.
- Be Bear Smart: leaving food and garbage unsecured will attract bears and other wild animals. This is dangerous for you and puts the bears at risk too. Never keep or consume food in your tent.
- Garbage/recycling must always be secured and disposed of properly. See the list of resources for drop-off locations.
- Ensure proper disposal of human waste and toilet paper. Dig a hole to bury both waste and paper if washroom facilities are unavailable. Please don't pollute waterways, beaches or trails.
- Please don't use toiletries in rivers and streams.
- Before leaving, return your site to the condition in which you found it. Pack out what you pack in.
- Be thoughtful and respectful. The community of Squamish and the environment thank you.

Unauthorized camping and related activities within the District of Squamish are addressed in the following municipal bylaws: Camping, Zoning, Park Use, Fire Service, Wildlife Attractant and Traffic Bylaws. Unauthorized camping includes but is not limited to: vehicle, tent, RV, temporary shelter in zones that do not permit this activity. Natural Resource Officers from the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development also enforce provincial natural resource legislation such as the Land Act and the Wildfire Act, where applicable.

CAMPING IS NOT PERMITTED


On **streets**, on **public land** including parks and parking lots, or **crown land** including forest service roads within District of Squamish boundaries.

Dispersed #NoTrace Crown land camping can occur outside District of Squamish boundaries.

Over 700 campsites and recreation sites in the area provide accommodation to visitors. Campgrounds are equipped with washroom facilities, fire rings and bearproof garbage facilities.




WASHROOMS
