

Hiking: Lower Shannon Falls

Dropping from a whopping 335 metres, Shannon Falls is BC's third tallest waterfall and the most popular spot for a picnic in the Sea to Sky corridor. Around the base of the falls, you'll find a well-maintained boardwalk and trail network to explore some of the area's towering trees, old-growth stumps and the ever-present mist from the roaring falls above.

The park is just off the highway and has a nice picnic area, BC Parks kiosk and a short, easy hike to the base of the falls. Just 350m each way, the Shannon Falls Trail meanders along the base of the falls through old growth Douglas Fir, Hemlock and Western Red Cedar. There are viewpoints along the way and even an opportunity to walk into the boulders at the base of Shannon Creek.

How to get there:

Shannon Falls Provincial Park is located just off the Sea to Sky Highway approximately 58 kilometres north of Vancouver and just 2 kilometres south of Squamish. The falls is adjacent to Stawamus Chief Provincial Park.

Route:

From the parking lot follow well signed trails into the woods to find the Shannon Falls Lookouts.
