## NATURAL WONDERS

The Stavanus: Chief: Commonly referred to as "The Chief", it dominates Squamish's styline and attracts hikers, climbers and sightsees from around the globe. It is one of the largest granite monoliths in the world and is a significant spiritual site for the areas first Nations people. Located within Stavamus Chief Provincial Park, the Chief's towering granite dome and surrounding area offer a camperourd, hiking trails, climbing for all levels and simply sunning sightseeing from its 3 summits.

Shannen Falls Provincial Park: It's hard to miss spectracular Shannen Falls. Reachable Eagles Provincial Park / Eagle Run DWL The Squamish area is world renowned for its wintering bald eagle population. The eagles arrive concentration in late December to January. There are several excellent viewing areas however the Eagle Run Viewing Shelter along the Squamish River Dyke has volunter interpreters on select weeknest and year-round informational kiosks to add value to your experience.

**Saribaldi Provincial Park:** Located 13 Lidenetres northeast of Squamish, the park offers some of Canada's most accessible hiking, backcountry stains, snowshoeing and alpine experiences. The Damond HeadZiffin Lakes are near Squamish is in the southwestern portion of the 194,650- hectare park and is an excellent way to get off the beatern track and into spectacular ajpine terrain.
