Extended Tour

- Each square in the grid represents a unique experience. Check them off as you go.
- Complete the extended tour and return to the Adventure Centre to show your photos, earn your 3 passport stamps, and pick up a Squamish souvenir sticker.

<p>#1 Adventure Centre</p> <p>The Squamish Adventure Centre is your starting point for exploring the community and finding local tips and experiences. Open daily from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., it's where many visitors begin their time in Squamish. Inside, you'll find visitor information, locally inspired goods, exhibits, a theatre, and a café.</p> <p>Challenge: Explore the Adventure Centre and snap a photo outside or at your favourite spot inside.</p>	<p>#2 Outside Loop</p> <p>Learn at the Centre: Explore the interpretive panels around the Adventure Centre to learn more about Squamish's history.</p> <p>Challenge: Take note of your favourite new fact about Squamish.</p>	<p>#3 Rose Park</p> <p>Located just across the parking lot from the Squamish Adventure Centre, Rose Park sits along the Mamquam Blind Channel and offers a quiet, scenic green space close to downtown. With waterfront views, open grassy areas, and frequent birdlife, it showcases a more relaxed side of Squamish.</p> <p>Challenge: Take a short walk through Rose Park and snap a photo along the water or in your favourite spot in the park.</p>
<p>#4 Stawamus Chief</p> <p>Monolith: From the Corridor Trail along the Mamquam Blind Channel, take in views of the Stawamus Chief. How many peaks can you spot? What rock is it made of?</p> <p>Challenge: Snap your best photo of the Chief and share it with the team at the Adventure Centre. Get creative!</p>	<p>#5 Sp'akw'us Feather Park</p> <p>Monument: Opened on May 25, 2024, Sp'akw'us Feather Park is located along Howe Sound at the Squamish Oceanfront. Visit the Land's End monument near the shoreline and explore the QR codes throughout the park, which share stories and cultural insights from the surrounding lands.</p> <p>Challenge: Take a photo with the monument framed by the surrounding scenery.</p>	<p>#6 O'Siyam Pavilion</p> <p>At the south end of Cleveland Avenue, you'll find the O'Siyam Pavilion. Surrounded by mountain views and the energy of downtown Squamish, it's a central gathering space for outdoor concerts, festivals, and community events, including the Arc'teryx Climb Academy each August.</p> <p>Challenge: Snap a photo at the O'Siyam Pavilion and capture the space where Squamish comes together.</p>
<p>#Downtown Art Murals</p> <p>Mural Walk: Explore one of the murals in downtown Squamish. Learn about the artist and what makes each piece unique.</p> <p>Challenge: Show the team a photo of the mural you chose and share its name. Use the QR code to access the Mural Map.</p> 	<p>#8 Welcome to Squamish Mural</p> <p>Welcome Sign: At Cleveland and Pemberton Avenue, you'll find a mural stretching across the side of a building welcoming visitors to Squamish's downtown core.</p> <p>Challenge: Take a selfie in front of the Welcome to Squamish sign.</p>	<p>#9 Visitor Centre</p> <p>Return to the Adventure Centre to show your completed extended tour, collect your stamps, and pick up your Squamish sticker.</p> <p>We'd love to hear about your experience, share your favourite stop or any feedback with our team.</p>
